General Information

THE FOLLOWING PAGES PROVIDE IMPORTANT INFORMATION REGARDING CAMP ACTIVITIES THIS YEAR. IT IS IMPORTANT TO READ EACH POINT CAREFULLY. YOU MAY WANT TO SAVE THIS SHEET FOR FUTURE REFERENCE.

- **1. Welcome to the family of Gan Israel Teen Camp!!** It is our aim to establish a close rapport with Gan Izzy Camp parents. If you have any questions, or wish to discuss any matter with us, please feel free to call our office/camp phone at 279-1200 or email us.
- **2.** Please be aware of your child's health and keep them home when there is any indication of an illness. In case of an emergency, we will first attempt to notify the parents, then the emergency contact. If neither can be reached, we will take the child to the nearest hospital emergency room.

3. Important - Read Carefully!

We planned several very special trips for the children that require your explicit permission. A daily activity schedule has been enclosed on the last page of this packet to give you time to prepare for each one accordingly. The following is a brief breakdown of each activity:

- ➤ Extreme Fun Center and Glacier Climbing: Our teens will be glacier climbing with MICA Guides, a reputable and professional outdoor tour company, who will take the group on a gorgeous and exciting adventure. They will also have a blast at the Extreme Fun Center! *Special waivers online*
- Horseback Riding and Reindeer Farm: Our teens will have the opportunity to take a fun and scenic trail ride with Alaska Horse Adventures! *Special waivers online*
- Pontoon boating, tubing, kayaking and paddleboarding at Big Lake!
- ➤ **Bike Riding** We will be going on a short bike ride on the coastal trail. More details will be sent in an email the day before the trip.
- 4. It is important that your child be dressed appropriately for each day's activities. This includes wearing a good pair of walking shoes and socks, always having a warm and waterproof jacket, and having a change of clothing and towel for water activity days. Campers who have not brought a change of clothes will not be allowed to participate in water activities. Please review the enclosed schedule and have your child prepared for the planned activities.
- **5.** Camp will be providing lunches, drinks and snacks to the teens every day, including for off campground trips.





- **7.** We strongly discourage bringing any valuable toys or electronics to Camp. Such items will be confiscated if found to be a distraction to the planned activities. These items will be returned to parents at the end of the day.
- 8. Phone Policy: Teens can bring their phones to camp and then set them aside in a special location for use only in emergency or great need. This helps keep the camp experience wholesome and healthy.
- **8.** Please inform the camp staff if there is someone else who will be picking up your child from camp. When picking up or dropping off your child, please make sure to personally sign them in and out on the sheet provided near the entrance, for safety purposes. Please be sure to read all emails and notices throughout camp, as they contain important information for you and your child.
- **10.** Camp days are long for all that are involved, campers and staff. **Earliest drop-off for campers is 8:50 am and please be prompt in picking them up at 4 pm,** unless the schedule states otherwise. Thank you! We will be in touch with you by email, phone or text if the teens are running late for a pickup.

Please do not send campers with valuable clothing that you are concerned about losing or getting dirty.

IMPORTANT: Each day campers should arrive prepared for all weather conditions that will likely include rain. We do not cancel activities for inclement weather - all campers must be prepared.

We recommend all campers wear:

- Comfortable clothing
- Shoes that tie and can be used for general activities
- Socks
- Jacket

Day Packs are brought daily and should always contain the following:

- Rain gear
- Complete change of clothes
- Water bottle
- Bug Spray
